




Paddles UP!

The Indigenous Innovation Initiative supports innovation by and for First Nation, Inuit and Metis Peoples, so they can solve complex challenges and improve well-being in their communities. We use a gender-lens investment approach, and in May 2020 launched the inaugural program *Advancing Indigenous Gender Equality through Innovation and Social Entrepreneurship*. Seeded with a \$10-million MATCH funding agreement from the Government of Canada's Department of Women and Gender Equality (WaGE), the goal of this program is to advance Indigenous gender equality through transformative innovation.

In partnership with community, a shared vision of gender equality for First Nation, Inuit and Metis women, men, Two Spirit, queer, Trans and other gender diverse people was created. Using the analogy of canoeing, Indigenous gender equality means that our paddles are up, we are finding our place within the canoe and we are paddling together as a community. We will know this vision has been achieved when we all have a place in the canoe, and are paddling forward together.

This artwork represents a traditional Salish canoe riding on waves with the rising sun above. Each paddle blade is different, representing the diversity of people. The overall message is that we are all in the same boat and must paddle forward together.
